Overview of Agricultural Interests in the B.C. Columbia Basin and Existing Programs and Initiatives

This discussion paper outlines Columbia Basin agricultural sector interests and concerns, and existing or recent initiatives that seek to address them.

Throughout the Province's public engagement on the Columbia River Treaty, Basin residents have spoken of agricultural losses sustained when valley bottoms were first inundated after construction of the Treaty dams. To help respond to these concerns, the B.C. Columbia River Treaty Team investigated existing federal, provincial and regional agriculture programs and initiatives with the potential to help address some of the interests. Over 40 programs were identified, which have been compiled in the table below.

The interests and concerns listed in column one of the table are based on three sources of information: 1) community interests feedback collected during B.C.'s <u>CRT 2018 community meetings</u>; 2) <u>Koocanusa Agriculture Sector recommendations</u> presented to the Columbia Basin Regional Advisory Committee in Spring 2019; and 3) Columbia Basin Rural Development Institute's April 2016 report: <u>Common Themes in the Three Agriculture Plans of the Columbia Basin-Boundary</u> <u>Region</u>. These interests and concerns were paired in column two of the table with existing or recent federal, provincial and regional agricultural sector programs and initiatives which appear to address them. Additional information on the programs or initiatives is provided in column three, including whether the program or initiative is currently accepting applications.

Some of the programs or initiatives have recently closed their application process but may reopen in the future. They are included in the table because they were available at the time the interest or concern was made. This table includes information that was available up to June 18, 2021.
